NEWS BITES FROM THE DEVIL

COLIN KASIM-RICHARDS TAKES THE LEAD ROLE

39 year old Colin Kasim-Richards joined as the club's Head Coach on 24th March for the remainder of the 2025/26 season.

The former professional footballer had recently been coaching in the Arsenal Youth set-up, having competed throughout the football pyramid in England and having also appeared on the international stage. Colin began his youth career with Queens Park Rangers and Arsenal before turning professional whilst a Youth at Bury.

After committing to Turkey internationally in 2007, he built an extensive career across Europe, playing for clubs including; Fenerbahçe, Toulouse, Galatasaray, Olympiacos, Bursaspor and Feyenoord. He has also played in Brazil and Mexico. Between 2007 and 2015, he earned 37 caps for Turkey, scoring twice, and also represented the country at U21 and B level (43 appearances and 3 goals across all levels).

UK wise - he played for Brighton & Hove Albion after leaving Bury. His varied and interesting career has also seen him feature for Sheffield United, Blackburn Rovers, Celtic and Derby County. He eventually hung up his shooting boots whilst at Turkish top flight club Karagümrük (one of the Istanbul districts) in 2023. Since his retirement from playing, Colin has worked behind the scenes, obtaining his coaching badges and performing some work with the PFA.

Colin ended up at Brighton in unusual circumstances: The player contract was arranged after a fan of the club, Aaron Berry, won the £250k for his club to sign Colin by entering a competition run by Coca-Cola. This led to him being known as the "Coca-Cola Kid" at the time.

JULIAN GREY BECOMES UNDERSTUDY

Julian Gray has joined the club from Birmingham City as Assistant Head-Coach to Colin Kazim-Richards. The 46 year old is UEFA A Licence qualified.

During his playing career as a left winger, Gray made his breakthrough at Arsenal. He moved to Crystal Palace in 2000, where he quickly established himself, playing a key role in their 2003-04 promotion and scoring in a famous FA Cup win over Liverpool at Anfield. In total he made 125 appearances and scored 11 goals for Palace.

In 2004, he went to Cardiff on loan before joining Birmingham City and was a regular starter there in his first Premier League season. He later played for Coventry City, Fulham, Barnsley and Walsall. He then spent two years in Cyprus with Nea Salamis Famagusta, before returning to Walsall in 2013 for a short second spell. In total he made 355 appearances (41 goals) in his playing days. After he called time on his successful playing career, he headed back to join Arsenal as a youth-team coach. He then headed to another former club, Birmingham, to take a similar role until being given his new job at Crawley.



DANNY CASHMAN LOANED TO U's

Local National league side Sutton United have signed Danny Cashman on loan until the end of the season. Cashman previously worked with the Sutton boss, Chris Agutter, at Worthing last season. Danny began his career as a Brighton Youth player, before being sent to Coventry - who loaned him to Rochdale, Walsall and Altrincham. He then went on to great success at Worthing, scoring 28 goals in 79 appearances. (He represented England at under-16 and under-17 level). Good to see him back in action following his long term injury. Danny had only managed 5 appearances before injury curtailed his Reds season.

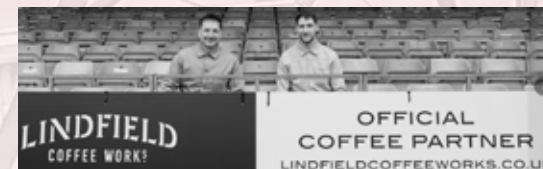


NEWS EDITOR FALLS ON HIS "SWORD"

FOCUS ON THE SUPPORTER GROUPS

In the Red Devils' Diary this week, I have chosen to talk about two groups who are there to make the lives of Crawley Town supporters a little better when, perhaps, things are not going as well as they might. Either for the club as a whole, or for individual supporters who, because of some disability need help to watch their club in a safe and enjoyable manner.

First up are the **Crawley Town Supporters Alliance (CTSA)** who were founded to **UNITE** the Crawley Town FC Supporters who were, before our promotion to the Football league back in 2011, "somewhat" represented by two bodies. Namely, the Crawley Town FC Supporters Club and The Devils' Trust.

The use of the word "somewhat" being my way to show that the majority of people who came through the home turnstiles chose, for whatever reason, to think and talk for themselves, which, of course, is everybody's inalienable right.

Throughout the history of our club, now known as Crawley Town FC, (since 1958 when the suffix Town was added) the fan base has always been very closely involved with the club they supported. This was especially so when we played at Town Meadow; with supporters helping to get games on when the pitch resembled a World War 1 battlefield or in helping to bring the dressing rooms back into a welcoming state in pre-season.

However, in the second half of the first decade of this new Millenium, after having secured a Conference place in 2004, our new owners, the Majeed Brothers, turned us into a full-time club, as far as the playing staff were concerned and before we knew it we were lumbered with debt.

Francis Vines, the manager who won us our Conference place and the Southern league Cup (**pictured right**), was sacked in March

2006 and the club announced that the entire squad was up for sale. Players and staff had seen their salaries cut in half, and in June 2006 the club entered administration and shortly after it emerged that Chas Majeed should not have been running a Football Club at all. (He was about as far away from passing a "fit and proper persons test" as it is possible to be.)

In response to all the doom and gloom at the club, supporters of all factions met at The Town Hall, and whilst it was not unanimous, a decision was made to set up a football trust which was called the Devils' Trust.

In the following season the Club was deducted 10 points, and we did well to finish in 18th place, which would have been 11th without the points deduction.

Shortly after the end of that season, the former Boston manager (and it has to be said, not very popular at the time) Steve Evans was appointed as manager. In hindsight this was probably the only good thing the Majeed brothers did in their short attempt at owning a football club.

The next year we finished on 60 points, after yet another points deduction, (this time of only 6 points) and finished in 15th place, but most



importantly the club had new owners, Prospect Estates, and we were starting to play our way, the Crawley way, out of our troubles. Over the next two seasons we overcame the last of our point deductions, this time it was only 1, finishing in 9th and 7th positions.

With this rise in our footballing fortunes the cracks in our fanbase began to heal and by the end of the next season we were celebrating promotion to the Football League due to the management of Steve Evans and the players that were brought to the club thanks to another set of new owners.

Bruce Winfield (ex-Town Mead Wanderers player), **pictured above**, and Sue Carter bought the club in July 2010 from Prospect, and the Reds embarked on a remarkable journey that unfortunately Bruce never got to see the end of.

Pleasingly Bruce did get to see us at Old Trafford in our famous FA Cup meeting, and

despite his doctor's advice, absented himself from St Catherine's Hospice on the evening of our three one win over those pesky Wombles at the Broadfield. That result did not clinch the title; that was to come later at Tamworth, but for all intents and purposes it was the clincher in what proved to be an awesome season.

Bruce had cancer and when advised not to go to the game on the 18th of March he simply said, "what could go wrong?" He lived for another three days and passed away on the 21st March, the day before we won at Eastbourne Borough.

I know that all Crawley Town fans owe this man so much, none more so than his ex-Town Mead Wanderers colleagues, six or seven of which are still watching the Red Devils.

With tears in my eyes, I'll get back to telling you about the CTSA. Just 13 days after Bruce had been at the Wombles game I sat in St John's church in Crawley Town Centre for Bruce's funeral next to the then chairman of the Devils' Trust, Ian Townsend; not just as one of Bruce's friends but also as the Chairman of the Crawley Town Supporters Club, and after the service we talked about honouring his wishes and put into motion the act of uniting the Devils' Trust with the CTFC Supporters Club.

The Community Engagement Team of the football club set out to make Bruce Winfield's vision a reality, and it was achieved by the formation of The Crawley Town Supporters Alliance on the 1st of July 2011 in the Redz bar at the Broadfield Stadium, after an almost unanimous vote.

Who are the CTSA and what do they do?

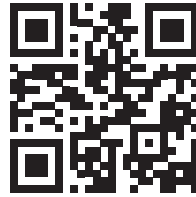
The CTSA are a registered Supporters Trust and therefore must act in a responsible, inclusive and accountable manner to their members, who each have a vote, with all the elected representatives and executives acting in an unpaid, voluntary, part-time capacity.

The CTSA provides representation, financial advantages, and social activities for the benefit of fans, the club, and our community. They provide an independent voice for Supporters that is formally recognised by the club.

In addition to representing Supporters, they also make life better for the fans of Crawley Town FC, through a number of practical means, which include:

- Discount on Club merchandise
- Priority booking for Cup games
- Raising funds for the Crawley Town Community Foundation
- Supporting local charities

THE DSA, DISABLED SUPPORTERS ASSOCIATION

The Crawley Town Disabled Supporters' Association was formed in 2014 at the invitation of our then CEO Michael Dunford. Following a survey, they soon had 27 paid up members, including some carers.

They first set about looking at the physical environment, in and around the stadium, and made a wish list for improvements which was discussed with the Club. The have been supportive of the DSA throughout and took note of their suggestions, making improvements that have included:

Improving the ramped entrance to Redz Bar, and the route out of the adjacent car park on to a bridge over a stream. It used to have uneven steps and was badly lit but is now ramped, surfaced, and well lit.

Introducing a professional Audio Description (AD) Commentary for our visually impaired fans and have extended it to away fans. The service is staffed by volunteers who are recruited and trained by Alan March Sport. It is widely praised by all those who use it, both home and away supporters.

The signage on accessible toilets has been improved to acknowledge that not all disabilities are visible. Additional accessible parking bays have been made available to book by blue badge holders who are also season ticket holders. The Club does not charge blue badge holders to park, and this extends to away fans too.

The disabilities of our members cover a whole range of physical and mental issues across the ages, from our youngest fans to our oldest, and most of them have enjoyed paying just

£5 for the season which is used to sponsor a player's shirt at a reduced rate, courtesy of the club, with all members having the chance to win the shirt in an end of season draw.

In the past, members have also been invited to attend a couple of training sessions each season and have photos taken with the whole squad and with DSA's sponsored player, but unfortunately this has not been possible at the Brighton Training Facility. Regular meetings were held during the season, usually starting with one in the Summer to wrap up the last season and make plans for the coming one. T

his was then followed by our AGM in September and another meeting December/January to organise our New Year dinner which happens in mid-January. Then there would be a couple more meetings in the second half of the season. Periodically raffles have been held to raise extra funds and with the profits the DSA have bought some ponchos that can be handed out on wet days if anyone needs them.

One of the members of the DSA is now employed by the club to get refreshments for disabled people in the raised wheelchair area on matchdays, who are unable to get their own. This came about following discussion at one of the DSA regular meetings and the club agreed to fund it.

The club opens Redz Bar for the DSA evening meetings, and the Bar Manager is there to serve, and the DSA are not charged for using the venue. Likewise, the DSA has held events in the Stadium Suite at no cost – these were for AD training and Level Playing Field regional events.

Unfortunately, the DSA is in a state of flux now due to the two stalwarts behind it, Barbara Robinson and Chris Cheshire, not being able, for personal reasons, to carry on the good work that has been achieved. As will always be the case with organisations representing disabled, the sick or senior in age members, there is always going to be a

“loss” of members as time goes by and when they happen to be key members some of the impetus can be lost as well.

Attendance at meetings has fallen, even when there have been guest speakers invited for Q & A sessions with popular players, which is possibly due to them being in the evening when people would prefer to stay in the comfort of their own home.

As Chris Cheshire, so succinctly has put it, “I don't think the horse is dead, but we need to stop flogging it!”

The DSA needs fresh ideas and energy. Crawley Town Football Club now has a new Disabled Supporters' Liaison person to replace Barbara Robinson, albeit four months after this post was promised.

Disabled Supporters Liaison is Emma Rogers who. I am told, wants to hold an open meeting to which all disabled supporters are invited. As a staff member, she has more access to who the disabled members are than the DSA. This will provide an ideal opportunity to invite people to join the association and contribute ideas about its function.

Chris would like the membership to be free, but for this to happen, it would have to be passed at a DSA AGM prior to the one proposed by the Disabled Supporters Liaison.

In closing this article for the Red Devils' Diary I would like to say that Barbara and Chris deserve a huge round of applause for what they have achieved with the DSA but with both having stood down or in the process of standing down “The Job needs new energy.... someone with new ideas and the enthusiasm to try them out”

The DSA must continue, because even if the number of our supporters who require our help reduces to zero, we must be prepared for the future and whatever that may bring.

Watch this space for details of the DSA AGM and please, if you or a loved one has a disability, attend it if you can.





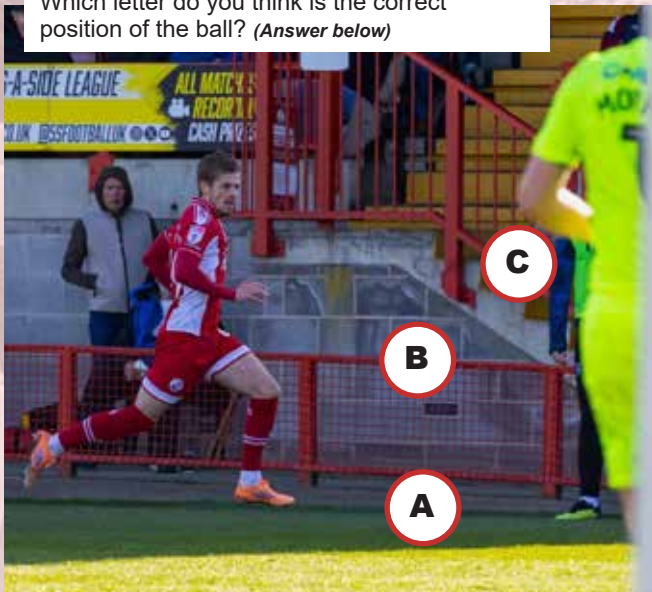

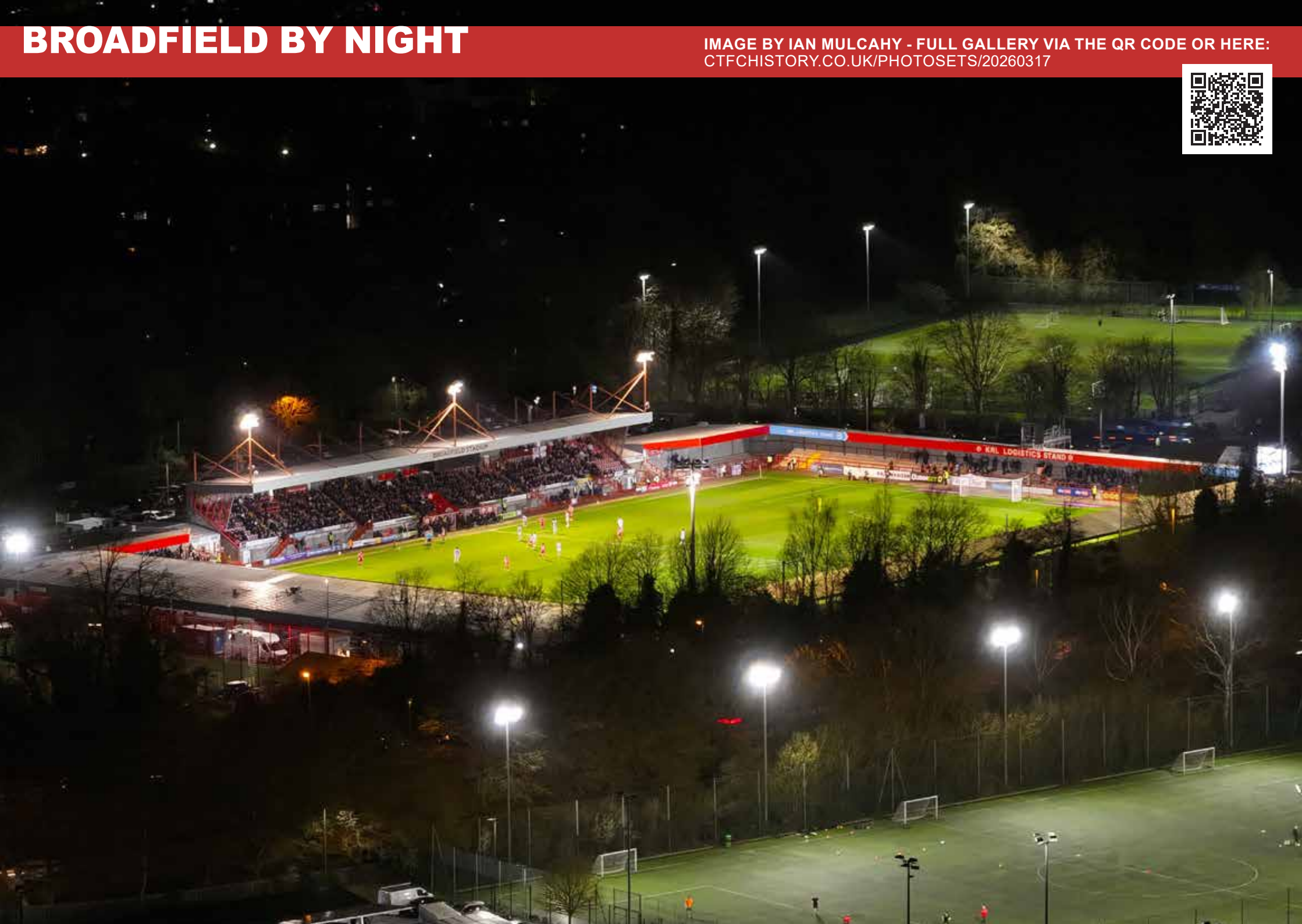

MEET THE MANAGER

DAVE ARTELL

Rotherham born Dave Artell (age 45) played as a Centre Back from 1998 to 2017. He made 467 appearances and scored 40 goals in total in his career. He also acquired 7 caps for Gibraltar. He is currently the 7th longest serving manager in league Two.



He started his playing career at his hometown club of Rotherham, before passing through the ranks of: Shrewsbury, Mansfield, Chester, Morecambe, Crewe, Northampton, Wrexham, Bala Town and Port Talbot Town. In July 2014, Artell became academy operations manager at former club Crewe Alexandra while still playing for Bala Town. He then managed Crewe from 2017 to 2022 before taking the reins at Grimsby in November 2023. He led Grimsby to yet more FA Cup fame this season, and his team were unfortunate to narrowly lose 0.1 at home to Premier League strugglers Wolves in the 4th Round. This followed a great run in the EFL League Cup – where they disposed of Manchester Utd on penalties and Championship Sheffield Wednesday, before coming unstuck against Premier League Brentford.

MORE ABOUT MANAGERS

As an EFL club, many a big name has taken charge of Crawley teams; among them England Internationals Chelsea’s John Hollins and Manchester United’s Steve Coppell, and Wales International Dean Saunders. It was Coppell, who was Director of Football when the second successive promotion took place in 2012. After just one season in League Two he took the club up into League One, where we stayed for three seasons. Other notable managers: Harry Kewell (Ex Leeds and Liverpool), John Gregory (6 England caps whilst with QPR), Gabrielle Cioffi, who has managed Verona and Udinese (Serie A Italy). Now Turkish International Colin Kasim-Richards can add himself to this list.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Grimsby Town’s highest ever final league position was 5th in Division One (Now the Premier league) in 1934-35).The club spent a total of 12 seasons in the top tier of English football.
- In WW2 Grimsby was the most bombed town in Lincolnshire. There was many a major raid near Blundell Park and it is said some shrapnel fragment damage can still be seen at the stadium today.
- Grimsby received £2m for the sale of John Oster to Everton in 1997 - which remains their highest transfer fee ever received. Oster was a winger/central midfielder. He played 487 games and scored 29 goals before retiring in 2015.

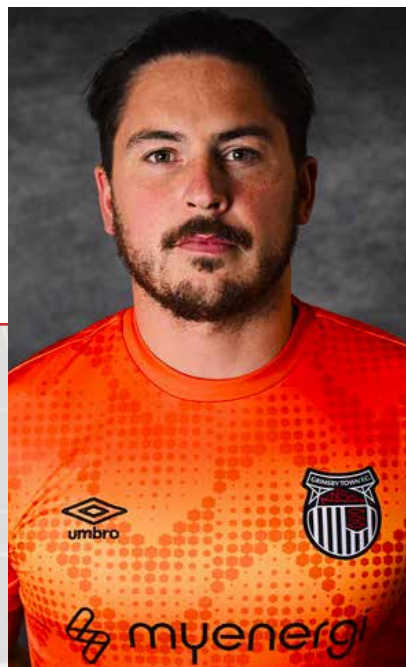
ONES TO WATCH

NO 7 JAMIE WALKER

The 32 year old Edinburgh born winger started out at Hearts in 2011. Whilst there, he amassed 154 appearances and 37 goals. He then saw service with Raith, Wigan and Peterborough before returning to Hearts in 2019 for another stint of 40 games (11 goals). He was then acquired by Bradford City where he racked up an impressive 108 games. He was with Scotland from U15 through to U21 level. He joined Grimsby on 25th June 2025.

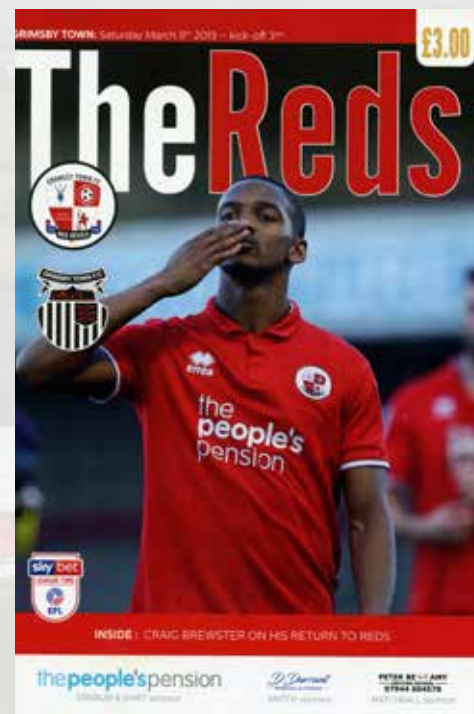


NO 1 CHRISTY PYM – The 30 year old Exeter born goalkeeper started as a youth at his hometown club – before being promoted to their senior ranks in 2012. Christy will have faced Crawley Town a fair few times in his career having made 151 appearances for Exeter, 82 for Peterborough, 23 for Stevenage, 126 for Mansfield before moving between the sticks for Grimsby in July 2025. Christy did also add 3 caps for England U20s to his CV. Interestingly Pym declared himself eligible to play for the Northern Ireland team in 2024. Thus on 8 October 2024, Pym received his first call-up to the Northern Ireland national team for UEFA Nations League matches against Belarus and Bulgaria.



THEY PLAYED FOR BOTH

We have had two very recent players who came from the Mariners to the Devils. **Toby Mullarkey** made 42 appearances (2 goals) from 2022 to 2024 before moving to the Reds and playing 31 games in the 24/25 season. He is now playing his trade at Fleetwood Town. **Gavan Holohan** turned out 124 times and scored 16 goals for Grimsby, before moving south to make 35 appearances for us from 2024 to 2026. Gavan is now back up north with Hartlepool Utd.



PREVIOUS FIXTURE PROGRAMME

Lewis Young featured on the cover of our March 2019 clash with the Mariners (we won 2-1). Italian Gabrielle Cioffi was the manager in charge at the time.

It is interesting to note that **Jake Hessenthaler**, *right*, was on the other side of the team sheet at the time. He played in 72 games for Grimsby.

He joined Crawley from Grimsby in 2020 and stayed for 99 games. (He is now at Ebbsfleet). Charles Vernam was in his first stint at Grimsby which spanned from 2018 to 2020. He returned to Blundell Park in 2023.

REDS 2-0 GILLINGHAM SATURDAY 28TH MARCH



Obviously, there is big news since the last game, manager Scott Lindsey has gone and has been replaced by rookie Colin Kazim-Richards.

The new manager has certainly rung the changes. Completely out of the squad for today, (since the Fleetwood game) are Geraldo Bajrami (who went off injured), Jonny Russell (on international duty), and Kellan Gordon (a bit of a shocker that one). Additionally Klaudi Lolos and Taylor Richards drop to the bench; which alarmingly still doesn't have a keeper on it, but it does have the reliable Max Anderson. Louie Copley also returns from injury and goes straight into the starting lineup, along with Tobi Ademeyo and Lewis Richards. Ade Adeyemo, and Ronan Darcy get promoted from the bench and start.

Meanwhile the weather can't make its mind up. Bright sunshine? Strong winds? A bit of hail? More sun? Bitter cold? Why not have all of them in a two-hour period? We are in our usual all red with white trim home kit, and Gillingham are in all blue. And Gillingham do that really annoying move of swapping ends before the kick-off. (Our poor cameraman Grant has to decamp and leg it to the other end quick smart.)



There is an early Gillingham shout for a handball in the box from a cross. We appear to be playing a back four, (at times it looks like three – maybe to fool the opposition) with Ade Adeyemo slotting in at right back. Scott Malone plays a ball out from defence into Lewis Richards in the box and his cross is deflected back off him and goes for a goal kick. Gillingham have a long throw merchant in their ranks, and he slings in a couple of early bombs into the box, we clear the first and get a free kick on the second one.

A Malone clearance goes over the east marquee for ball loss one of the day. We break and Dion Pereira crosses it, Tobi Adeyemo gets to it out on the left, and plays it to Ronan Darcy, he lays it back to Richards, whose cross hits T Adeyemo's back and bounces to Crawley old boy Glenn Morris in the Gills goal. (If we were Bromley that would have looped in to the net – but our deflections never seem to find the goal). We win a corner down the right, and it's taken deep out to the left, T Adeyemo gets to it and is fouled near the other corner flag. The free kick is taken short and we lose it.

A Adeyemo misses his header in midfield and Gillingham break into the box, but he hares back to make the tackle, and Jacob Chapman collects. There is a Gillingham player down on the edge of the box needing lengthy treatment.

When we restart Gillingham attack down the right and work the ball into the box and

get a shot which Chapman saves, but the ref blows for a foul in the build-up, and we get a free kick. It is played long up the right to T Adeyemo, he exchanges passes with A Adeyemo and gets into the box before laying it back to Jay Williams and his shot from just outside the box goes just wide. Gillingham go up the other end and have a shot themselves, which drifts wide left. They get into the box again and a last ditch A Adeyemo tackle puts it out for a corner. It's taken short and back to the taker and then swung in deep and straight out for a goal kick. (Cue the mocking jeers of the Reds fans.)

Williams wins a free kick in the middle of the Gillingham half, but Chapman is down requiring treatment in the middle by the d of the penalty area. With all the players rushing to the bench for instructions it does beg the question of how genuine it is. The free kick is taken out wide to

T Adeyemo who plays it back to Ronan Darcy, only for his return to be too strong and the keeper collects. A ball out of defence gets to Danilo Orsi on halfway and he is the only Crawley player in that half and after driving it forward about twenty yards he is just outnumbered and brushed off the ball.

A long ball forward from Gillingham sees A Adeyemo forced to concede a corner. It is taken low and goes straight through the box and is put out for another corner on the other side. That is taken to the near post and the header on it goes wide.

Every time the ball goes long to T Adeyemo his marking defender is trying to take his shirt off him, to the extent there have been plenty of nipples on display (instead of just the usual tits out there). Then he is scythed down near halfway, and does get a free kick, and there is a booking for the Gillingham player. It goes into the box and A Adeyemo beats a man and gives it to the very lively and industrious Louie Copley, and he is tackled for a corner.

It goes to the near post, and the keeper makes a hash of it but is lucky as it bounces straight back to him. There are four added minutes at the end of the half. T Adeyemo is fouled again, he gets the free kick, but bizarrely also gets a long lecture from the ref. Gillingham

win a corner, it is taken short and then put in deep and there is a scramble in the box and Gillingham are claiming a handball for a penalty again; those claims are waved away and the half time whistle goes with the score at 0-0. We might have had a bit of luck there for once.

Into the second half and the first serious action sees Orsi getting cleaned out from behind, and he is down injured and cannot continue so needs substituting, with Harry McKirdy coming on to replace him. A Gillingham throw down the line is then crossed; it comes all the way over to the other side and there is a shot which Malone chests down and clears off the line for a corner. It is taken deep and goes straight out for a goal kick. T Adeyemo is pulled back whilst on the break, and the ref gives a free kick. It should be a booking and probably would have been if it had been any other player apart from the one Gillingham player the ref had booked in the first half!

There is a ball out to A Adeyemo, and he plays in onto Pereira down the wing, he gets it into McKirdy in the box and his shot is saved, T Adeyemo gets to the rebound but slices his shot and it goes over the bar. At the other end Gillingham get into the box, have a shot which is put out for a corner, it's swung in straight to Chapman.

He boots it out to Pereira down the right, and he plays it back to Williams, there's a cross into the box and McKirdy gets to it and gets a shot off which is saved. The clearance is long and bounces twice before finding a Gillingham player in our box, and they have a shot which goes out over the Eden Utilities Stand for ball loss two of the day. We play it out to Williams, and he plays a ball forward, but it is headed back out, he slides in to win the ball, but when it goes forward, we have two players offside.

A long ball forward by Gillingham is shepherded back to Chapman but Malone is down from the challenge. He takes a while to get back to his feet but looks all right.

And then the next time Gillingham get into our box Malone is in the wars again, this time taking a high boot to the chest which sees a booking for the Gillingham striker. (He shows the stud marks to the ref but he isn't interested in viewing Malone's chest). We work the ball out down the left, across to Williams in the middle, and over again to A Adeyemo on the right, and he lines up a shot from outside the box, which flies over the bar and over the KRL Logistics stand for ball loss three of the day. Gillingham get the ball forward again, and as we clear it from our box, immediately A Adeyemo is absolutely clattered and there is a third booking for Gillingham.

It is time for a raft of substitutions, with Copley, Pereira, and Darcy making way for the returning Max Anderson, Taylor Richards, and Harry Forster. Williams gets a booking in midfield. Not sure how much contact there was, but the dive to the ground by the Gillingham number 30 would have scored highly for artistic merit in the Olympics. The free kick goes into the box and is headed out for a throw. It's taken long, headed back to the taker and a cross goes to the back post where the header goes straight to Chapman. We make our final substitution with L Richards making way for Akin Odumayo, which means A Adeyemo swaps over to left back now. There is then five minutes of not very much football at all. A bit of filler. Broken when Gillingham get down the right and put in a deep cross, which Odumayo heads out for a corner. The subsequent kick is punched clear by Chapman.

There are six added minutes, and people have been streaming out for the last five minutes. Forster goes down the left and puts a cross in, but it is cleared, Odumayo wins it back and plays it to

T Adeyemo in the box, he plays it back to Odumayo and then it is on to T Richards on the edge of the box, he cuts across two steps to the left and lets fly, and it squeezes into the bottom corner and we lead 1-0. Which just makes me want to say to those leaving early – HA HA! Seriously, we've scored late - late goals in our last three home matches, where are you going five minutes before the end of the game? (Where Crawley are concerned it is certainly never over until that blast of the final whistle.)

We play it out from the back, down the left again; Forster makes a superb run and beats a man and then plays it inside to T Adeyemo in the box, he takes a touch and then slams a shot into the back of the net kissing the inside of the post on the way, and we lead 2-0. Absolute scenes. What a feeling of relief and happiness. The extra couple of minutes on top of the six indicated were to be expected and we play them out safely and come away with a 2-0 win. What a great result for Colin Kazim-Richards in his first match as manager. Let's hope it's the first of many.

We have seen the pre-kick-off huddle in the middle of the pitch from our players all season, but today saw a post-game one, a new message of togetherness under the new manager perhaps? Before they started their applause of the fans – well, those who were still there and hadn't missed the two goals and the victory. It may not have been pretty at times, but there was commitment there and at this point results are much more important than performances, and goals scored are much more important than the number of "xylophones gathered".

FINALLY A TROPHY & SENIOR FOOTBALL

Writing this just prior to the Gillingham game and the week before Newport away, I am praying for some new-manager bounce in those games, as the previous tactic of hoping there are at least two teams worse than us in the EFL is a bit high-risk for me. Anyway, good luck, Colin, may your time with us be successful!

As we need a lift at present, I thought I would – as promised in the last article – revisit the time when the first team were aiming to lift their first cup. It was the season of 1925-26, and we had fought our way through to the final of the Montgomery Cup, the prize being a trophy which had been presented by a Crawley man, Archie Montgomery of Ifield Hall, in 1909.

We had reached the final in February 1926 with a comfortable 5-0 semi-final victory over Lindfield, with goals from Alec Begbie (2), Knight (2) and Jack Chipperfield Snr, but would face stiff opposition in the final against a Haywards Heath side looking to retain the trophy. Both sides had won one of the league games they contested against each other that season, but a crowd of over 1,000 had gathered at Ardingly, with the street “filled with charabancs and motors” (as reported in the press) depositing Hayward Heath fans in their blue and white and Crawley fans in their red colours. Apparently Haywards Heath were favoured to win by two thirds of the crowd, and in fact went ahead after thirteen minutes when a poor clearance was returned for a goal, before Crawley equalised just two minutes later when Elliott set up Miller to score.

However, a strong Haywards Heath side continued to press, and retook the lead before a handball in the box by a Heath defender enabled Ted Horn to blast home a penalty and level the scores at 2-2.

An end-to-end second half brought chances for both sides, but Crawley would gain the

crucial next goal in the 72nd minute when Crawley centre-half Matthews drove forward with the ball to set up Begbie, who hit the ball high into the net to send the Crawley fans wild. Further chances fell to Crawley before one final effort for Heath was cleared off the line by A Horn. Crawley had won the trophy they had been seeking for over twenty years.

I have included a photo of the victorious team with the trophy and their medals. Not all the pictured team line-up is known, but our chairman, G F H “Frank” Banks, is the tall figure at the back, and in the front row from the left we have Jack Chipperfield Snr, then Ted Horn, Billy “Wally” Elliott, John Coward and far right “Ranji” Horn. As I have mentioned before, Ted Horn was the grandad of season-ticket-holder Steve Horn, who sits next to me, and “Ranji” was his great-uncle. In fact Ted had a longer association with the club than I initially realised, as he became team manager in the late 1940s, at a time when his son Don Horn (Steve’s dad) was banging in the goals for Crawley.

The Montgomery Cup was actually the third trophy claimed by Crawley, but the first cup won by the first team, with all three victories leaving Haywards Heath as runners-up. Firstly, in 1902-03, we had beaten Heath to the Mid

Sussex League title, then in the 1922-23 season our reserves had again beaten Heath in the inaugural Mowatt Cup final (then just known as the Mid Sussex Junior Cup) by an emphatic four goals to nil.

Moving things forward to just 80 years ago and the 1945-46 season (see team line-up picture), which saw the club restart after WW2. I came across the annual report for that season and it seems from the summary the club had big plans to grow, and had managed to gain entry to the County League and senior football. The competition was, I think, called the Sussex County War Emergency League for that season, with life struggling to get back to normal after the war and men slowly returning to civilian life after military service. It would have been quite a step up for our relatively small-town club at the time, and the end-of-season report highlights our progress.

The summary from our chairman of the time, Norman Longley (later Sir Norman), highlights how far we had come in just the nine months since our AGM in 1945 when, despite a disappointing turn-out, the club voted to try for senior football in the county. Since then, Mr Longley states, “I realise the extent of what I think has been the growth in those few months of the enthusiasm for football of a high standard among the people of Crawley.” He thanks long-time club servant Ernie Dennett

for his efforts in persuading the County League officials that we should be allowed entry into the league. We were placed into the Eastern Division of the Sussex County Emergency League, meaning much work was required to make our “ground” at Yetmans Field (thanks to Mr F Yetman) fit for senior football. Mr Longley then thanked Mr and Mrs Gear for allowing the use of The Sun Hotel (roughly by the entrance to the Leisure Park) as club HQ. Various establishments have been used as such over our history, starting with The George Hotel and including The Railway Hotel, The White Hart, Ancient Priors and Northgate Café.

We would use The Sun for meetings as well as pre- and post-match refreshments, and also for changing facilities for the players as The Sun was but a short distance from Yetmans Field.

In the report, Mr Longley also highlighted the problems of attracting enough players of the appropriate standard, and it seems we even resorted to advertising on the screen of the Embassy Cinema (where Turtle Bay is now) before the start of the entertainment for this purpose.

All this led to a reasonable season for the first team. Including both friendlies and league games; we won twelve, drew two and lost fifteen. With our County League record being thirteen points out of a possible twenty-eight (obviously reduced sized leagues at the time).

Mr Longley mentioned how we almost created a huge shock in the Sussex Senior Cup (over two legs we lost to HMS Marlborough - having won the home leg 5-2 and lost 10-3 away!), but did manage to beat the league leaders Haywards Heath (them again!) on their own ground as we managed a creditable mid-table finish (Brighton 'A' finished second from bottom).

One last thing I want to include from the document is the Income and Expenditure, just to show relative costs involved in running a volunteer-led club playing senior football at the time. I will leave you to read through these fascinating items.

I see we even had to pay tax on entertainment, lots of which I hope to see in the remains of this current season. Or failing that, some wins will do!
